Travel to Banff

Travel time from the Calgary International Airport to Banff, where our event will unfold, is approximately one hour and 30 minutes and approximately 118 kilometers from the western city limits of Calgary.

Banff is a resort town in the province of Alberta, located within Banff National Park. The peaks of Mt. Rundle and Mt. Cascade, part of the Rocky Mountains, dominate its skyline. On Banff Avenue, the main thoroughfare, boutiques and restaurants mix with château-style hotels and souvenir shops. The surrounding 6,500 square kilometres of parkland are home to wildlife including elk and grizzly bears.

Banff National Park

Your very scenic drive towards Banff will provide a taste of picture-perfect mountains and an abundance of wildlife and little towns peppered along the way. <u>Banff National Park</u> is Canada's first national park and the flagship of the nation's park system with over three million visitors per year. Banff is part of the Canadian Rocky Mountain Parks and is deemed a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Park Pass

When entering Banff National Park, a park pass is required to help support visitor services and facilities. You can either purchase a pass at the park gates or pre-purchase. <u>Please see their</u> website here for rates.


